



To our account holders and potential account holders:

In accordance with Section 326 of the USA Patriot Act of 2001, which requires Eastern Utah Community Credit Union to help the government fight the funding of terrorism and money laundering activities, EUCCU is required to obtain basic identifying information from you and verify that information when you open a new account.

This means that the credit union employee opening the account will ask you for some basic information, such as; your name, address, date of birth, and other information designed to help us identify you. We will also ask to see a non-expired government-issued photo identification, such as; a drivers license, passport, and/or a social security card or some other government-issued document.

In some cases, identification will be requested for those individuals conducting business with EUCCU prior to the effective date of the member identification requirements. This is because original documentation was not obtained with the opening of the account or if we are unable to form a reasonable belief that we know the true identity of the existing account holder.

In all cases, protection of our members identity and confidentiality is the Credit Union's pledge to you. We appreciate your patience and understanding as we all do our part in complying with the member identification procedures required by the federal USA Patriot Act.
